

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

RESPONSIBILITY: The management will use all care to insure safety for exhibits after their arrival, but in no case will they be responsible for any loss or damage done to, or arising from, any animal or article on exhibit. The exhibitors shall indemnify the fair management against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. Every animal or article shall be entered and exhibited in the name of the bonafide owner.

SHOW ELIGIBILITY: Exhibitors must be bonafide members of a Colorado 4-H Club or Vocational Agriculture Program. Members who are 8 years-of-age and have not reached their 19th birthday prior to January 1st of the current year are eligible to compete. A member considered to be in good standing must pay state dues, attend a majority of the club meetings, complete a project, present a demonstration to the club, participate in club-sponsored events and perform community service. A current and up-to-date record book is required and must be presented when entering all projects, with the exception of livestock. **All live-stock exhibitors must complete interview judging in their county prior to the fair.**

LIVESTOCK MARKET SHOW AND SALE ELIGIBILITY: The Southeast Weld County Livestock Sale is a terminal sale. Animals eligible for the market show and sale must be owned by a 4-H or FFA member residing in or physically attending the RE-3J school district. All exhibitors must live in the District or physically attend Re-3J schools from tagging and/or weigh-in date until the day of Fair in order to be eligible for the sale. Exhibitors may tag up to 5 market animals per species, but only 3 can be weighed and shown. The livestock sale is limited to the following number of animals of each species as follows:

- beef - 23 • sheep - 23 • swine - 23 • goats - 11

All Grand and Reserve Champions must sell unless one of the following exceptions occur: As a rule, there will be only one animal sold per exhibitor. In the event that one exhibitor is awarded Grand Champion in more than one market species, that exhibitor shall be required to select which species he/she will sell. If a single exhibitor is awarded a Grand Champion and Reserve Champion within the same market class or across all market classes, the Grand Champion animal is required to sell. Should an exhibitor be awarded a Reserve Champion in more than one market species, that exhibitor shall be required to select which species he/she will sell.

In order to be eligible to participate in the livestock sale, the exhibitor must have completed the market project in the species that the exhibitor sold the previous year. **Sellers must provide proof of successful completion of the Quality Meat Assurance Program (if their county requires it) and attend a livestock record book interview through the CSU Extension Office.** Sellers must have a premise ID number. Sale eligibility will be determined after the show and exhibitors have declared which animal they intend to sell. **A sale card must be turned into the fair office by the exhibitor before the Round Robin competition begins.** Animals will be sifted on a percentage basis by class within each spe-

cies. Any questions need to be addressed to the respective species superintendents.

LIVESTOCK ENTRIES: Beef cattle are not to arrive before 4:00 p.m. on Thursday. Beef weigh-in starts at 8:00 a.m. Friday and after second call, beef weigh-in closes and sheep weigh-in starts immediately. All entries must be in place by 8:00 a.m. the day of the show. Any exhibits arriving before or leaving without permission from their respective superintendent will forfeit their prize money.

Bedding will not be provided by the Fair Association. All livestock exhibitors will groom and fit their own livestock projects or be helped by a 4-H member, FFA member, or immediate family member, if needed. Livestock must be shown by the exhibitor personally unless there is prior approval by the superintendent in charge. Another Southeast Weld County Fair exhibitor may substitute if there is a conflict. Failure to appear when a class is called will not justify a class recall. **There will be a \$100.00 charge for not cleaning livestock pens at checkout.**

SPECIAL NOTICE: Grounds for disqualification include:

- **No use of tranquilizers in any livestock being exhibited.**
- **No use of artificial stimulants administered on the fairgrounds without a veterinarian present.**
- **No unethical livestock practices to enhance the appearance of any species. No drenching or pumping of any livestock species allowed, unless administered by veterinarian.**
- **No Unruly animals that could cause harm to individuals at the fair.**

All animals are subject to inspection by a veterinarian at weigh-in. Any prize money won by an animal will be withheld if it is found to be showing the effects of tranquilization or alteration while at the Fair. Violators will be disqualified. It is against federal regulation to sell an animal for slaughter before the approved withdrawal period for a drug. Any animal can be tested at the Fairboard's discretion. The Fairboard reserves the right to disqualify any unruly animal. The Fairboard's decision on all disqualifications is final.

PROTESTS: All protests must be made in writing and presented to the superintendent in charge of the respective division. **All protests must be made within 24 hours after the event occurred and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit before any action will be taken by the SE Weld County Fairboard. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.**

PREMIUMS: No animal or article deemed unworthy will be awarded a premium. The award of premiums will be limited to entries named in the premium list. When there is no competition between exhibitors, only one ribbon and premium can be awarded at the discretion of the judge. The judge's decision will be final. Premiums may be picked up at the Fair Office on Saturday after 2:00 p.m. Any premiums not picked up by 4:00 p.m. on Sunday become the property of the Southeast Weld County Junior Fair Association.

NOTE: We follow county guidelines for eligibility. All rules pertaining to the Southeast Weld County Fair are subject to final interpretation by the Southeast Weld County Fairboard.

1. Open to anyone age 10 and up. There will be a Junior Division for 10-12 year olds, an Intermediate Division for 13-15 year-olds, and a Senior Division for 16-18-year-olds.
2. Contestants will be disqualified for failure to observe any safety precautions.
3. The tractor is hooked to the trailer or implement.
4. The width of the trailer will be 8 feet.
5. The drawbar hitch, if swinging, will be pinned.
6. Time starts at the signal from the driver. Operator will release the brakes and drive the tractor through the course.
7. Timing ends when operator signals that tractor is back at starting point and properly parked. Failure to set brakes at end of route will penalize driver.
8. If at any time the driver knocks a marker down, he must stop and correctly complete that part of the course before proceeding.

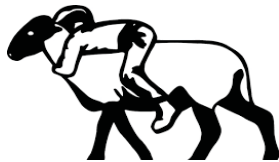

For your convenience, the Fair Board will transport slaughter animals to the meat processors. It is your responsibility to call the packing house with your cutting instructions.

RESALE-The buyer designates to the sales clerk the animal to be resold. In this case, the buyer pays only the difference between the sale price and the resale price. No other arrangements are necessary. However, if the buyer donates the animal back to the Fair Board, the buyer pays the full purchase price.

Example: Buyer purchases a animal for \$600.00

Sale Price	\$600.00
Resale Value	124.00
Buyer will pay	\$476.00

In the event you are unable to attend this sale, TBK Bank & Trust can arrange to bid on an animal for you. In addition, if you have a designated dollar amount you care to donate, this donation can be combined with others to purchase an animal.
